We kindly ask that pineapple is not brought into school in packed lunches.

To avoid choking, please slice grapes and large blueberries into quarters and we ask that nuts are not included in lunch boxes for the same reason.

Just a few requests:

Jewellery

Jewellery can be easily broken or damaged during a fun-filled day at Nursery and may even cause harm to a child, if caught or snagged. We respectfully ask that jewellery is not worn at Nursery, with the exception of small ear studs.

Names in clothing

To reduce lost belongings, please label all items of clothing brought into Nursery.

Nappies

For speed and ease of changing, we request that normal nappies (with sticky tabs) are brought into Nursery, rather than the nappy pants. Pull Ups are, of course, still fine for those who are potty training.

We will endeavour to work alongside your preferences, but we also want to reduce the time that children are away from their learning whilst being changed.
